This role is open to those completing 10th grade in 2020-2021 school year.

Please check off EACH item prior to submitting your application.

STEP ONE

- ALL pages of the application are complete. Please print as clearly as possible or submit a typed version of the questions and answers.

- THREE (3) reference letters must be submitted with application. They can be from anyone other than a family member that can best speak to your character, and should have known you for at least one year. Examples include, but are not limited to: Teacher, coach, club advisor. Please have each reference form placed in a sealed and signed envelope, or the individual writing your letter may email it directly to crooney@ymcaulster.org

STEP TWO

1. If mailing/dropping off, place both the completed application (pages 3,4,& 5) and three letters of reference in a single envelope/package.
